With a shared vision and a collective investment of 55,000 Afghanis, the saving group members turned their aspirations into a thriving enterprise.

Since its launch, the baking factory has become a vibrant hub of economic activity in the village. Producing 200 loans daily for commercial sales, the factory has demonstrated efficiency, quality, and a strong market presence. What truly sets this initiative apart is the active involvement of saving group beneficiaries in every aspect of production, embodying a sense of ownership, collaboration, and hands-on entrepreneurship.

Beyond its commercial success, the baking factory plays a vital role in enhancing community welfare. It dedicates over 140 raw breads daily to cooking for customers, ensuring access to fresh, locally produced baked goods. This dual-purpose approach not only bolsters economic prosperity but also meets the pressing needs of the community, reinforcing the factory's role as a cornerstone of village well-being.
