We hope for a future where;

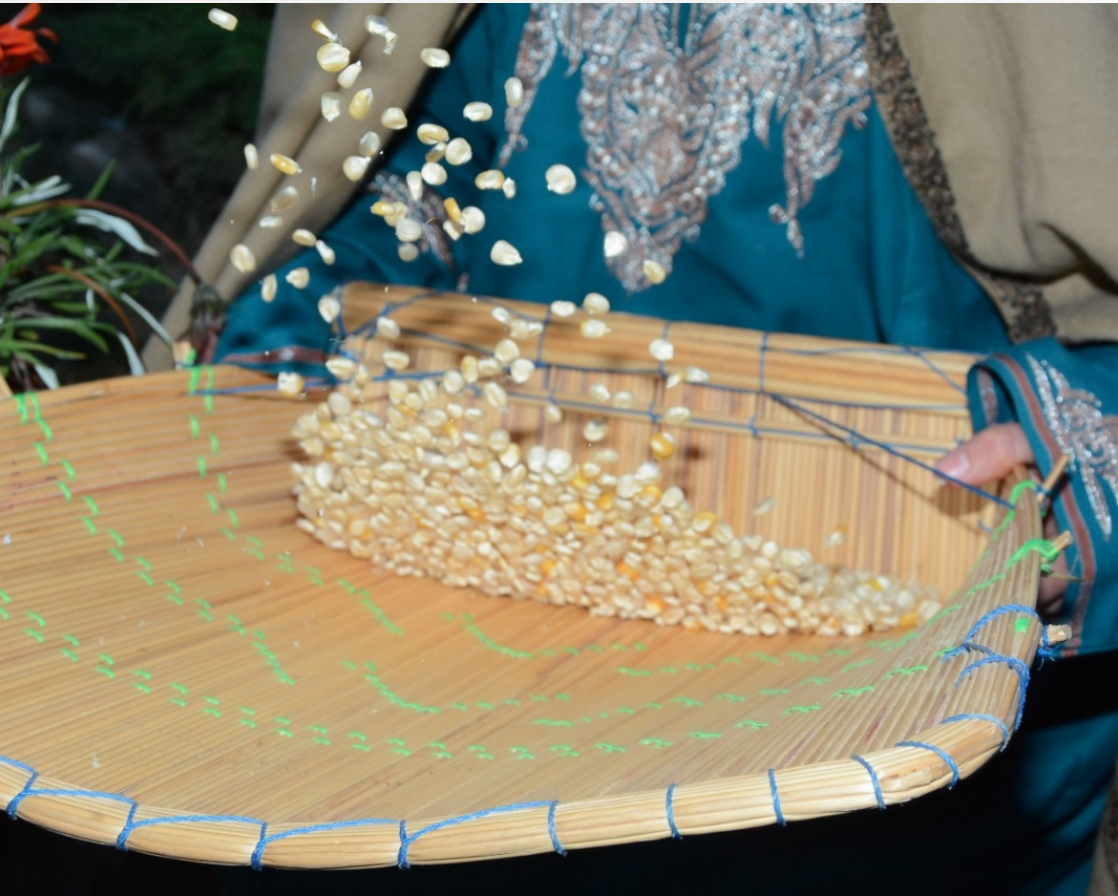
- People are protected from violence and conflicts.

We apply a bottom-up approach that encourages strong community participation while working in partnership with local-level organizations and community groups. We encourage the active involvement of the target communities in the project design, monitoring, and implementation.

We have a consistent approach to strengthening grass-root mechanisms because they play a crucial role in sustainability and development effectiveness. We design and execute need-based and locally tailored solutions to deal with the root cause of marginalization and vulnerabilities. In this way, our key focus domains are:

Advocacy on governance, accountability and system reforms  
Economic Empowerment, providing healthcare services and ;  
Reducing vulnerability .



## NSDO 2020-2025 strategy lays strong emphasis on three Change Goals:

### CG-2 Enhancement and creation of local level earning and employment opportunities.

Adopting innovations to strengthen on-farm and off-farm livelihood, upgrading value chains, and rural productivity, increasing access to financial services and enterprise development.

### CG-3 Reduce vulnerability to natural disasters and climate change.

This will include vulnerability analysis, mapping, strengthening community-level preparedness and response capacities, and building community-based systems and support mechanisms.



### CG-1 Campaigns on Human Rights Governance and Accountability.


We will build more pressure on the government to improve governance, accountability in public institutions, system reforms in favor of women and marginalized groups, campaigns on girls' education, peace building, and conflict resolutions.

An estimated 3.7 million children are out-of-school in Afghanistan – 60% of them are girls.

**Clean Water & Hygiene**

Only 63 percent of Afghans have access to basic drinking water, and only 39 percent have access to basic sanitation.



**Food Security/Nutrition**

Over 11 million population of Afghanistan is suffering from food insecurity and malnutrition.



**Enterprise Development**

More than half of Afghanistan's 30 million people live below the poverty line.



**Life Saving & Resilience**

The low level of socio-economic development makes Afghanistan extremely vulnerable to disasters.



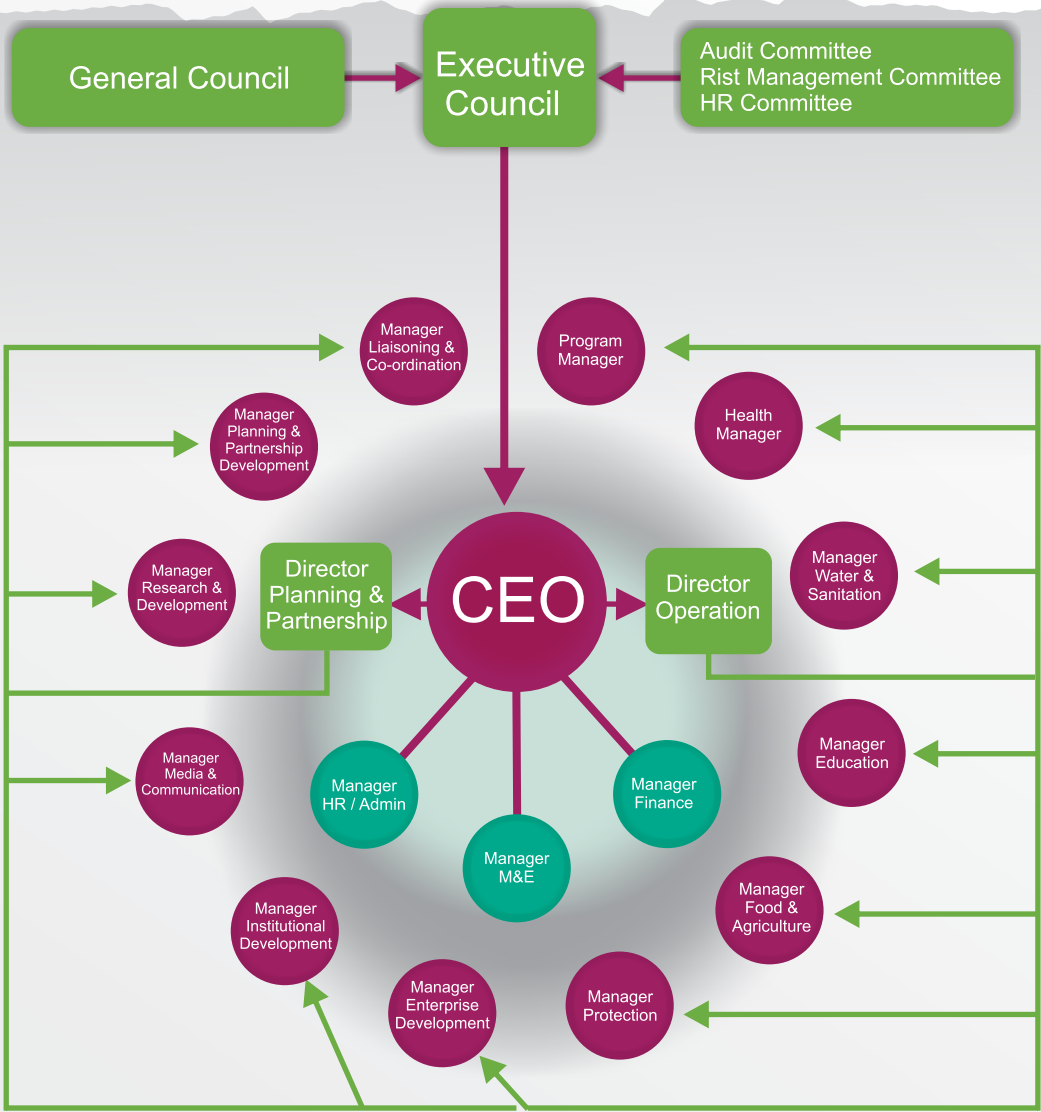

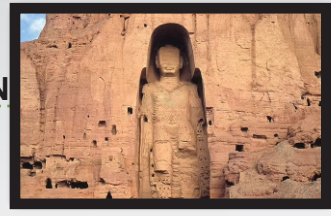

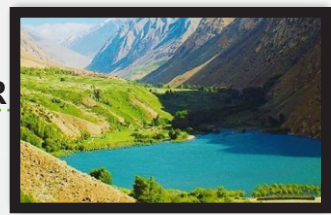

- Certified by Afghanistan Institute of Civil Society (AICS)

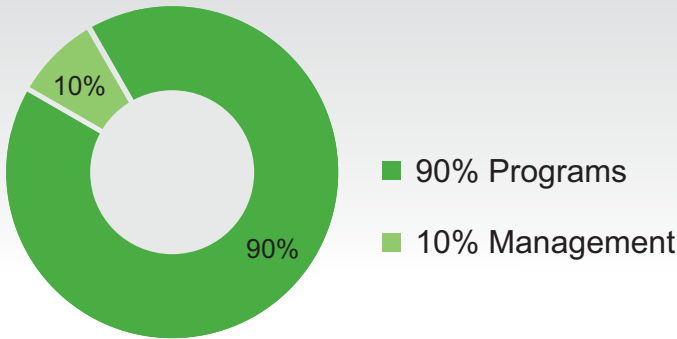






We are accountable to our donors and partner communities. We are always working to keep our overhead cost at a low level, and it is our policy to utilize as minimum resources on non-programs functions.
