We hope for a future where;

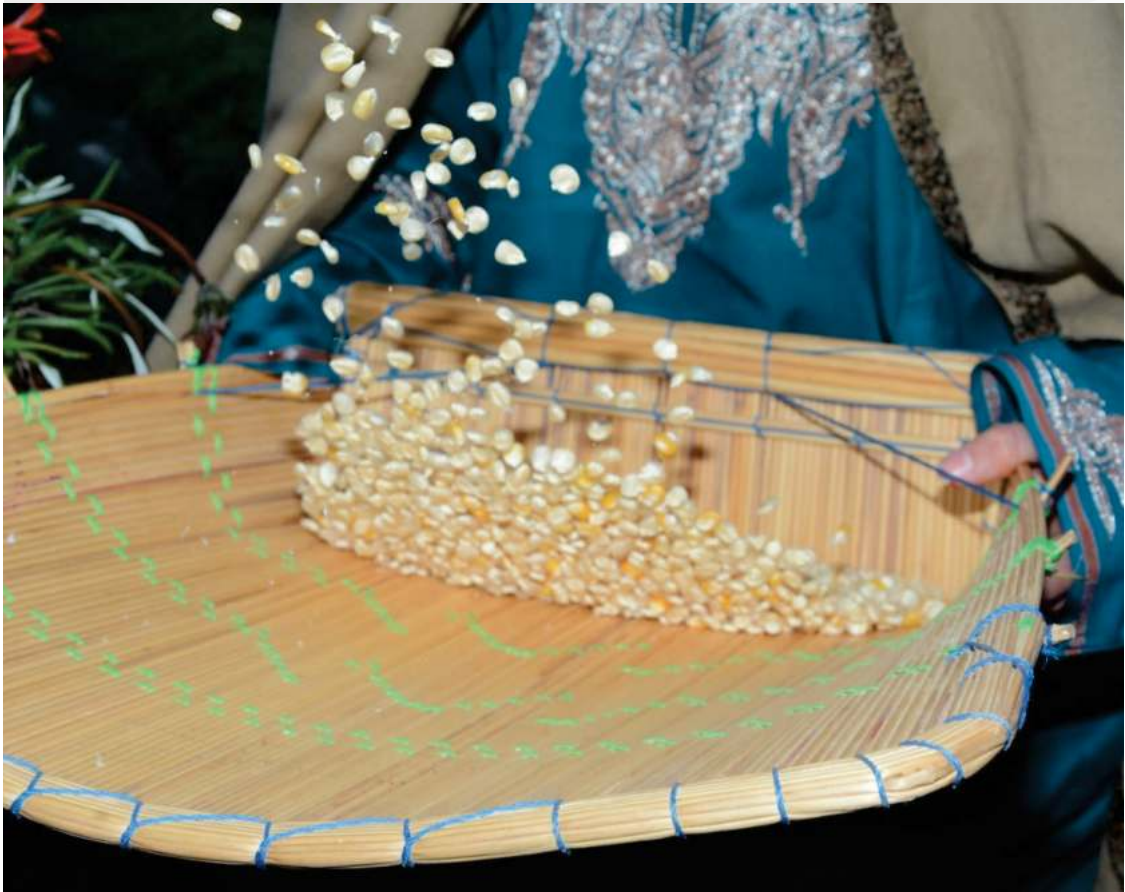
- People are protected from violence and conflicts.

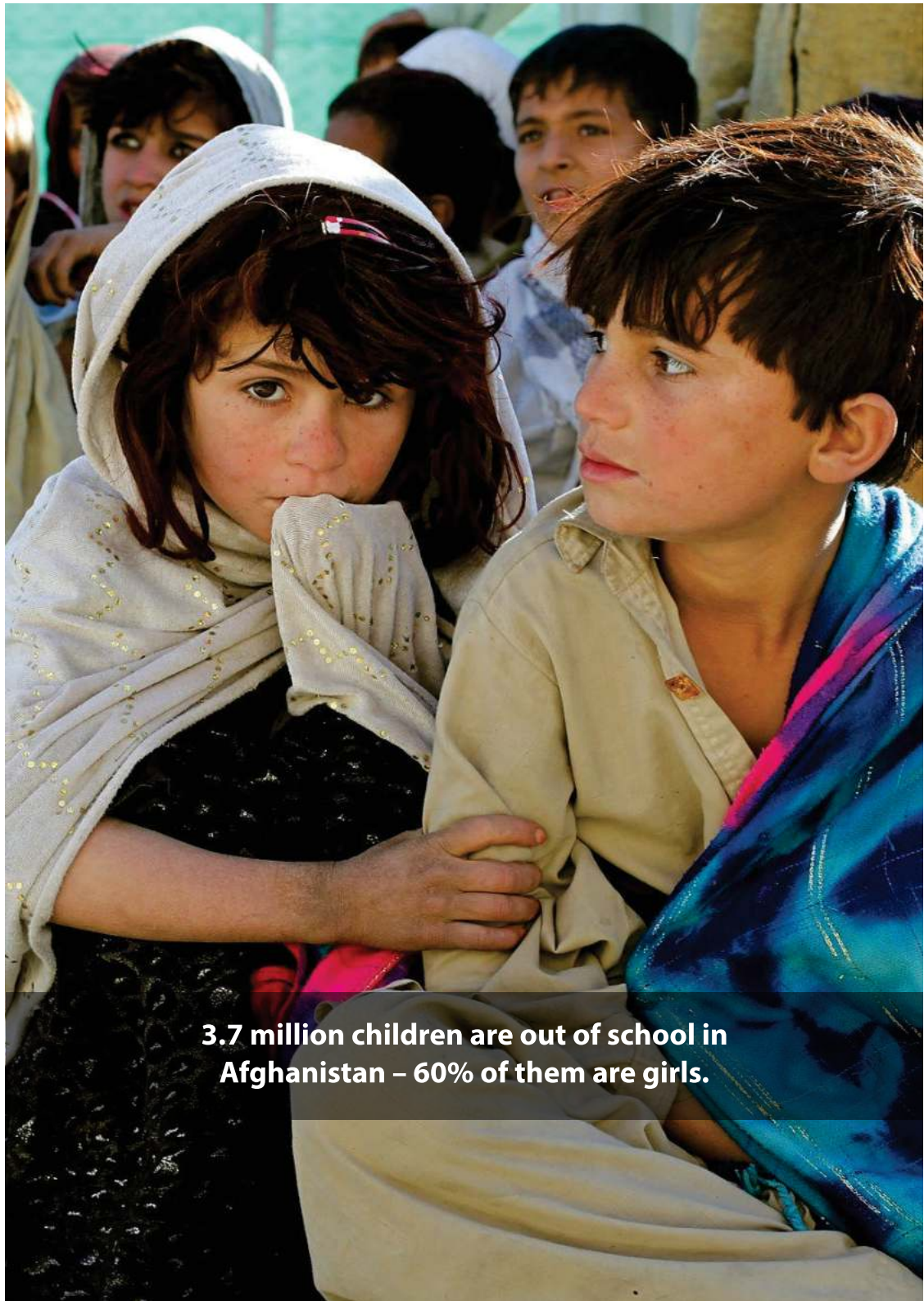
Advocacy on governance, accountability and system reforms

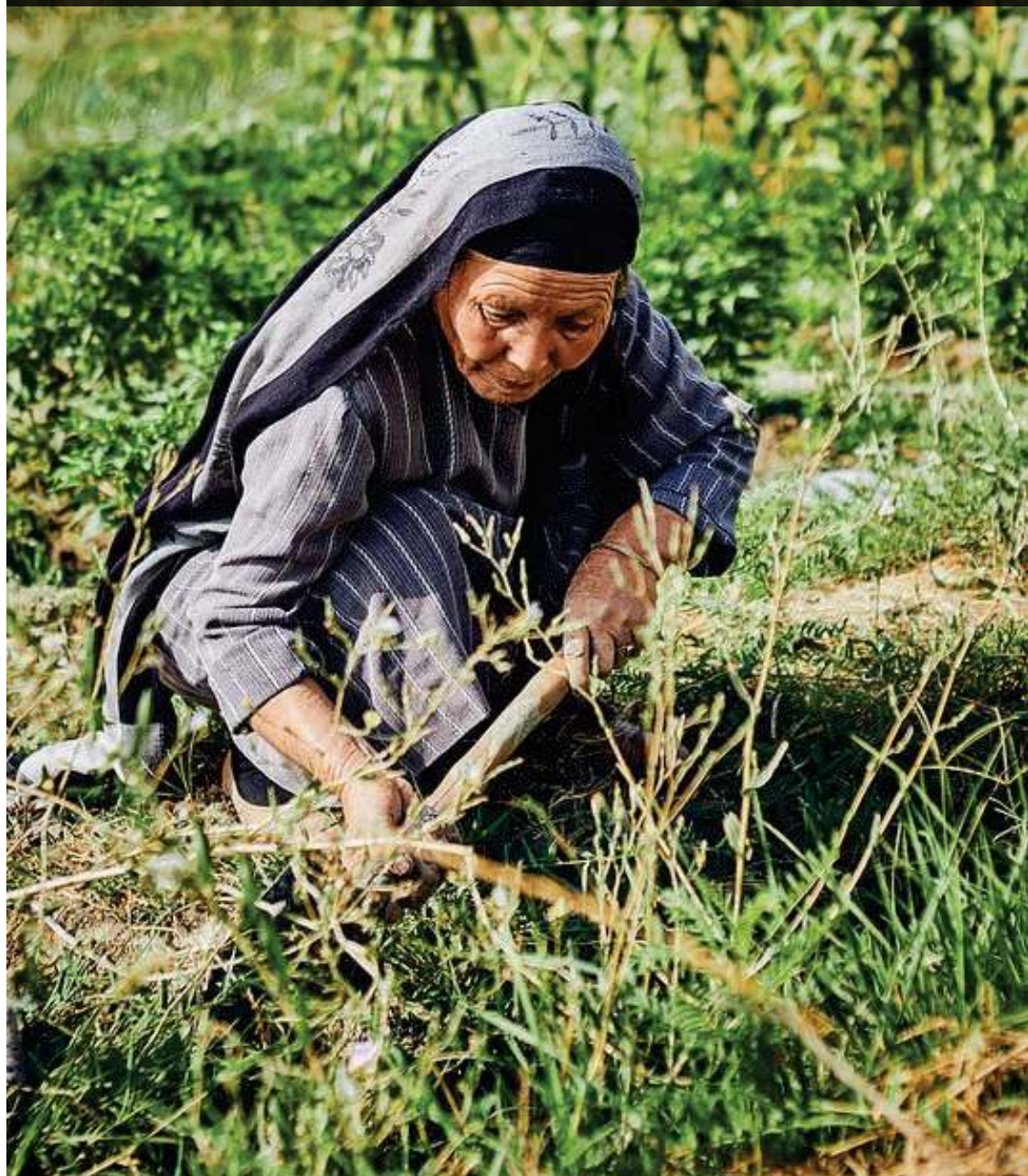


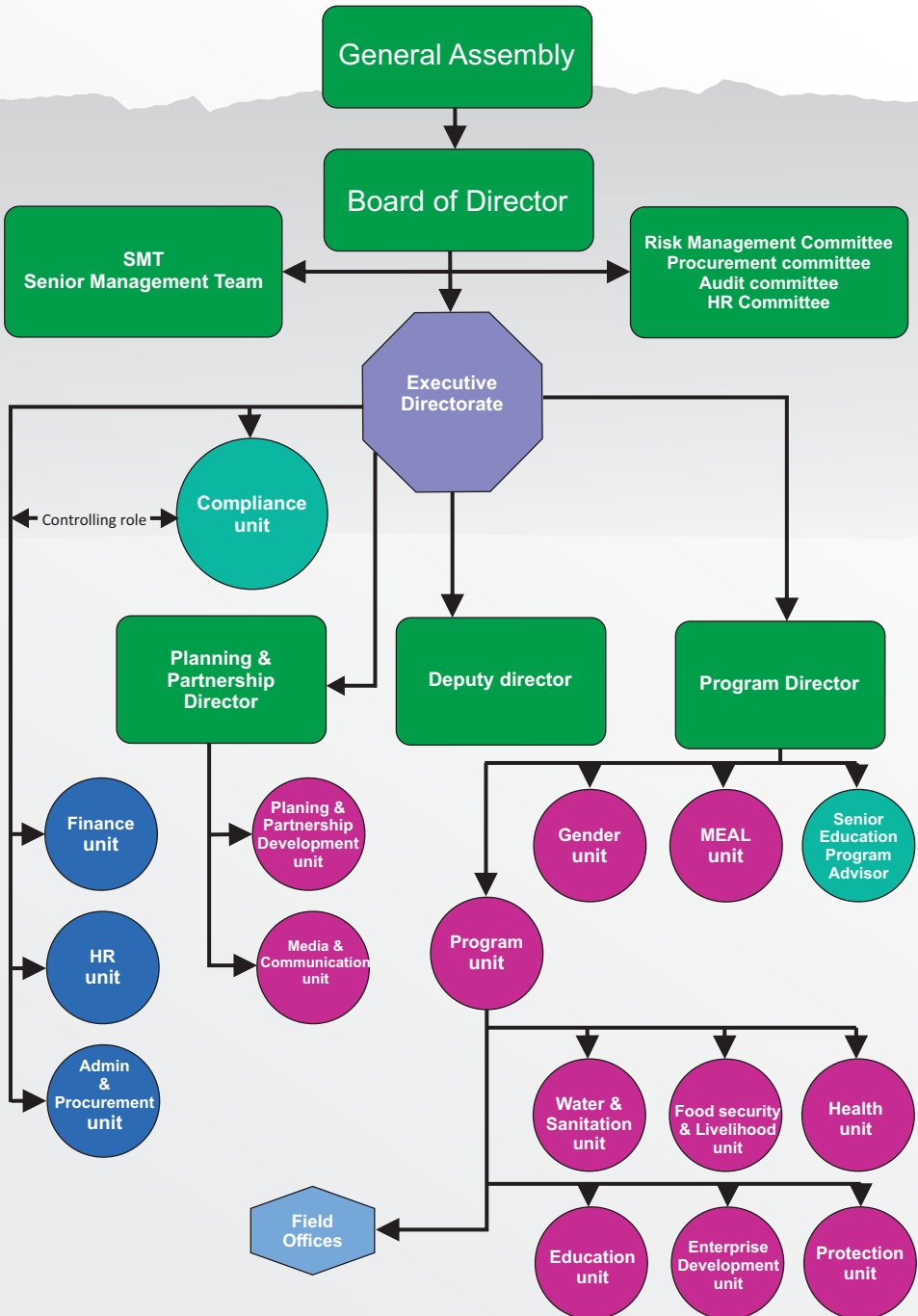

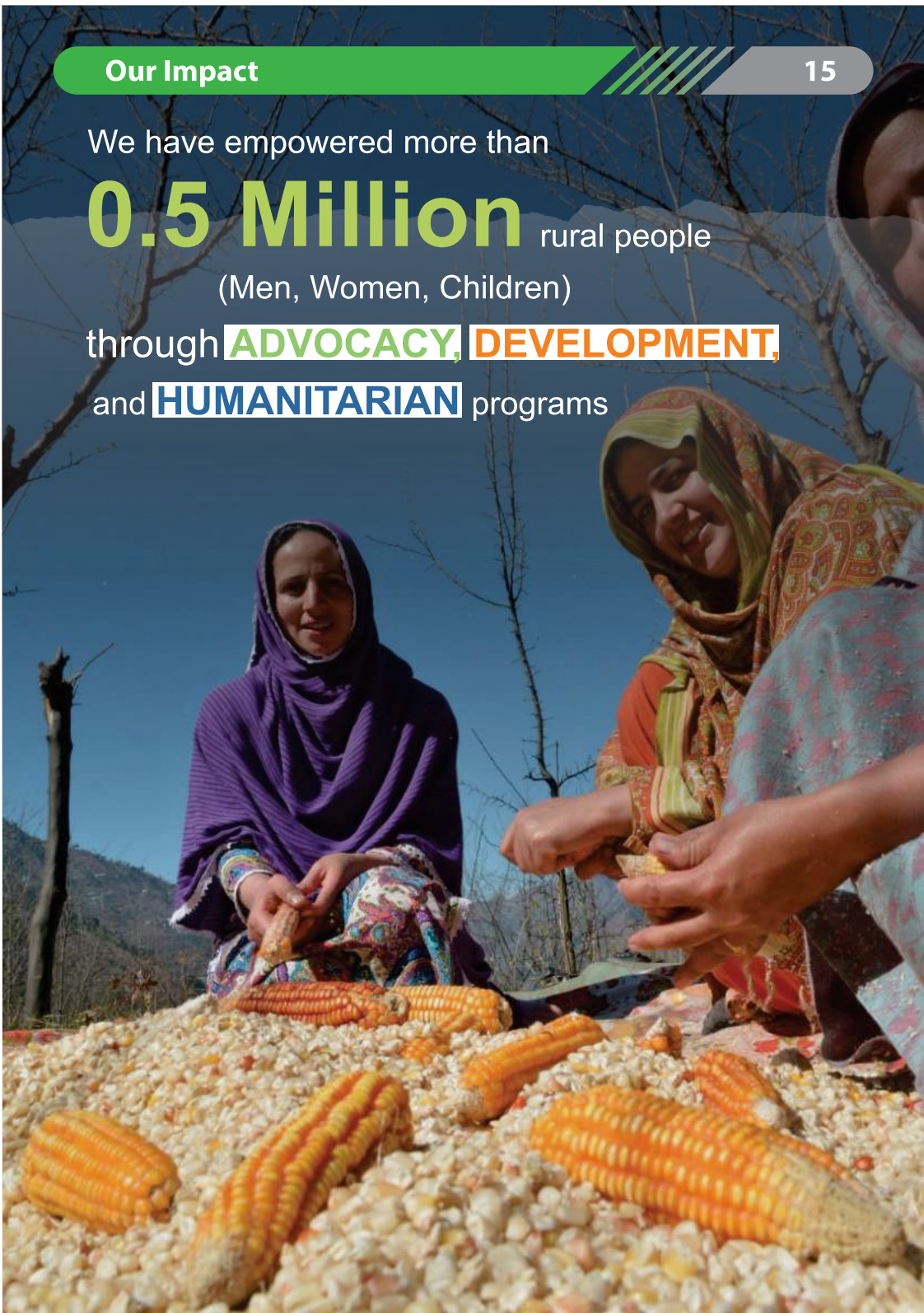

We are member of multiple development, advocacy and humanitarian forum. We are certified by the National and International bodies.

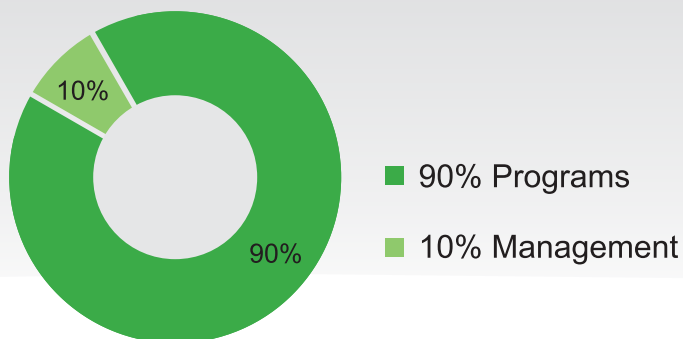
