WFP Seasonal Food Assistance & Hotspot Response - Takhar Province

Delivering Lifesaving Aid to 562 Vulnerable Families in Dasht-e-Qala

In partnership with WFP, NSDO continued its emergency food assistance in Takhar, targeting pregnant and lactating women (PLWs) and children under five.

- Distribution points improved for dignity and access

Targeting & Distribution

- 592 households registered via SCOPE
- Verified food dispatch: 72.7 MT
- Distribution conducted on June 14

MSMEs-BBKS Project – Enterprise & Skills Training in Kunduz & Takhar

Empowering Micro-Entrepreneurs Through Practical Training

NSDO continued its enterprise development and vocational training for youth and women, with strong monitoring and support mechanisms.

Key Achievements - June 2025:

Third Party Monitoring (TPM)

 Donor TPM teams reviewed training documents and conducted interviews with 272 beneficiaries

Enterprise Development Training

- 216-hour curriculum underway
- Online Marketing module 69.2% completed

Bag-Making Vocational Training (Women)

- 108 hours delivered
- Modules in leather processing and safety completed

Monitoring & Support

- MEAL teams conducted regular field visits
- Recommendations implemented to improve training quality

Material & Transport Support

- Monthly stipend: 2,996 AFN
- Raw materials provided to enhance hands-on learning
